Discusses a sermon which he preached and which was published, sends copy to Bishop.

Sydney Report to Bishop. Discusses increasing church membership; the Bishop's visit; the need for more ministers to reach the scattered areas and initiate schools, etc.

Sydney Report to Bishop. Specifically discusses the state of schools and education.

Sydney Letter to Bishop. Mentions three events which changed the routine of his year (1) trip to Halifax from Bishop's invitation "to attend the visitation of the clergy", (2) the opening of "the small church at Cow Bay" (discusses the activity of the congregation), (3) a private matter concerning an encouraging letter from his father.

Statement of affairs concerning education in Horton and an appeal for help to build a school house. Comments how he is actually situated in Cornwallis (6 miles from Horton) and therefore feels that the presence of the church is weak there.
- 101 1842 February Report to Bishop. Discusses religious condition of the district. Mentions need for Bibles and the building of a parsonage.

- 102 1843 January Report to Bishop. Discusses his difficulties in his work because of presence of Dissenting Sects. Comments on some of the spiritual and scriptural differences. Writes of the parsonage in more detail.
- 103a 1845 March 28 Letter to Secretary of Society concerning the building of a church in the Kentville area.
- 103b 1845 May 14 To Mr. Hawkins, Secretary of Society. A memo from J.B. Murray which accompanied the above letter.

126	1843 June 1	Letter to Secretary before returning to his mission at Port Hill, Prince Edward Island. Letter sent from Halifax on his arrival. Discusses his meeting with the Bishop.
127	1844 July 22	Westmorland Harbour, Prince Edward Island. Letter to Secretary of Society. Discusses "the prospects of our church". Mentions how many places for "Divine worship" he has opened; how many Sunday Schools, how many services he performs, etc. Discusses the ethnic background (Scottish) of his flock, etc.

- 128 1845 June 26 Report to Bishop. Gives a detailed account of his various activities and the presence and problem of dissenters. Mentions need for another clergyman, and mentions a Mr. Filleul.
- 129 1846 Jan 19 Report to Bishop.

- 130 1847 Jan 1 Report to Bishop. Discusses his work and its effect in hopeful terms. Mentions the Bishop's visit.
- 131 1848 Jan 1 Report to Bishop. Discusses how his congregation is becoming "more serious and devout"; mentions his visits to the sick in some detail.
- 132 1849 Jan 3 Report to Bishop. "From the Census Returns which have been recently made the members of the Church in this District exceed all other Protestant denominations."
- 133 1850 Jan 28 Answers to Rev. E. Hawkins' (Secretary of Society) questions.
- 134 1850 Jan 1 Report to Bishop. Discusses his visits to distant settlements.
- 135 1851 Jan 2 Letter to Archdeacon Willis. Sending his Report to him "in the absence of the Bishop". Discusses his visits to other settlements and the building of a church in Springfield which had the patronage of Miss Fanning, daughter of a late Lieutenant-Governor.
- 136a 1853 Jan 3 St. Eleanor Report to Bishop. Description of his mission and his duties performed. Discusses the construction of a parsonage. Mentions the death of "3 aged members of my flock".
- 136b 1853 April 4 St. Eleanor Quarterly Report to Bishop - in great detail of services performed, etc.
- 137a [1853] St. Eleanor Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending June 1853 in great detail, as above, mentions death of a Sunday School teacher.

Mentions with regret the erection of a Romish Chapel in the area even though there are only three families "who adopt the Popish religion". Also mentions activities of the Wesleyans. Discusses the conversion of a "poor French man" from Popery. Requests a grant of French Prayer Books and Testaments.

- 138a [1854] Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending March 1854. Gives an account of a family whose children joined the Church and the dissention it caused within it.

- 138c [1854] Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending September 1854. Discusses his travels.
- 138d 1854 Dec 31 Annual Report to Bishop, from October to December. Discusses his visits to his parishoners.

- 139a [1855] Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending March 1855. Discusses how his time has been mostly occupied with visiting the sick and dying.
- 139b [1855] Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending June 1855. "my parochial duties have become more onerous from the increase of population, principally caused by the rapid growth of the neighbouring village of Summerside..."

- 140b [1855] Quarterly Report to Bishop for period ending December 1855. Discusses his pastoral visits and the importance of them. Parsonage will not be ready until Spring.
