## STRACHAN'S LETTER BOOK TO CHURCH SOCIETIES

The arrangement of letters and the numbering of pages in this letter book is rather confusing. Letters to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, ranging in date from 1839 to 1866, begin at the front of the volume and continue past the middle. Letters to other Church Societies, covering approximately the same dates, begin at the back of the book. From the front of the volume, page numbers run from 3 to 214. Beginning at the back, they go from 1 to 144. The two sets of numbers meet and then overlap for a few pages, so that these pages bear two different numbers. For instance, page 212 from the front is page 144 from the back.

It was stated in the introduction to the Strachan Papers at the beginning of Reel 1 that copies of letters from the Rev. Ernest Hawkins, Secretary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, 1843-64, would be microfilmed at the end of Strachan's Letter Book to Church Societies. However, it has been decided to microfilm them after the front section of the letter book, since, being replies to Strachan's letters to the S.P.G., it is that part of the volume which they supplement. It was also stated that Hawkins' letters covered the years 1851-5. This is true of one group of the copies, but others were acquired by the Archives at different times. All have now been interfiled and cover the years 1849-63. Some, but not all, of these letters are listed in the calendar which follows.

Letter to the Rev. A. M. Campbell. Mentions some of his plans for his diocese. Recommends to the Society for adoption and gives an account of the Rev. Geo. Hallam, Penetanguishene, the Rev. F. G. Elliott, Colchester, the Rev. Thos. Smith Kennedy, Clarke & Darlington, the Rev. Geo. C. Street, the Rev. Thos. B. Fuller; refers special cases to the Society - the Rev. Rev. James C. Usher, Brantford, the Rev. Thos. Fidler, Fenelon Falls; the Rev. Abraham F. Atkinson, Bath; the Rev. Geo. Graham, Trafalgar; the Rev. Chas. Matthews and the Rev. Geo. Maynard, masters at Upper Canada College. Reports on the Rev. Robert Taylor, Newmarket; the Rev. Michael Boomer, Galt; and the Rev. Sm. Norris. Tells about his candidates for Holy Orders - and mentions two Methodists, the Rev. John Elanegan and the Rev. Adam Townley. Expects the people to contribute towards the support of their clergy and mentions some of their expenses. Takes up the subject of a Widows' Fund. Brings up the question of granting allowances to theological students. Discusses the best way of using Miss Fenshawe's noble donation, and the law governing gifts to the church. Is educating a young coloured man, Peter Gallego, with the idea of his taking Orders, to work among his own people, about 500 of them being in Toronto, all from the United States, and many run-away slaves. As vested interests are to be respected, may not system lately adopted prevent some clergy from proving a vested interest in the Reserves? Our object must be to secure the largest amount for the longest time. Report of Church University Proceedings gives pleasure. Application by Dr. O'Meara for grant for Schoolmaster and Mistress must be declined. He also asks for a stipend for a clergyman for Bruce Mines; this must be referred to the Church Society.

Dr. Beavan has written regarding subdivision of diocese and implies that he would be glad to take charge of the Diocese of St. Mary's. Says Archbp [Archbn ?] Stuart will give half his income to a Bishop of Kingston. This would benefit the Church, for by resigning this sum to a middle aged man the Church might hold it for a longer period under "Vested Rights". Hope £400 for income of Bishop of Kingston may be charged to Clergy Reserves. The Society has £14,000 capital for endowment of N.A. bishops. The whole income, £440, has gone to Bishop Inglis. By investing the capital in Canada debentures £440 might be given to the new Bishop of Nova Scotia and £300 to the new Bishop of Kingston, for which office Rev. J. Cecil Wynter is proposed. Attention will be given the Bishop's letter to Lord John Russell.

The Bishop's letter to Lord John Russell received from the Bishop of Montreal and submitted to Gladstone. The latter, however, not prepared to resist demand of Colonial Legislature to the management of the Reserves. Reference to English Convocation in Synod should be omitted, but much of the letter is of importance to make public. Lord Grey will offer to the Colonies every facility to establish their own Church. If the Bishop were to summon his clergy, a plan of selecting by delegates might be agreed on, and so the basis of



a Synod laid. The Bishop of Bath and Wells talked about Dr. Beavan. Would it be better for a Bishop of Kingston to be sent from England or elected from the clergy in Canada? Has been told by 3 clergymen from Canada that Archd Bethune unacceptable. Would Beavan or Herchmer be more so?

1851 / Two copies of the printed letter to Lord John Russell  
25 April enclosed. Two omissions made and a few verbal corrections.  
London Copies have been sent to Lord John Russell, Lord Grey, &c.  
Glad to learn that the Bishop is using every exertion  
to resist aggression: Everything depends upon the  
resolution and perseverance of the Church Party in the  
Colony. Sees that a positive beginning of the Church  
University has been made. Expect a competent man to take  
Wardenship will be found. Rejoices that the Bishop has  
summoned a sort of voluntary Synod. As yet no mention has  
been made of the Reserves Bill in the House of Lords, and  
it is improbable that Grey will find time to do so  
this session.

1854 The Society will accept the bill (£1,700) of the  
28 July Treasurers of the Clergy Reserves. But in future  
London a special application must be made before any missionary  
be added to the list. Glad the Bishop is to organize  
the country to secure the return of members favourable  
to rights of the Church. Glad, too, that the Bishop  
is advising the clergy to proceed on principles agreed  
on in, last year's bill in H. of Lords. It is believed  
that act of submission does not apply to Diocesan Synods,  
and that there is no restriction preventing diocesan  
clergy from meeting in synod. Rejoices at progress made  
in the Bishopric endowment fund. Sir Geo. Prevost  
would go--if called.

1855 The Bishop's long silence caused a fear that he was  
28 Dec. dissatisfied with the Society's final award. Had tried  
London to secure a handsome sum which was honestly due to  
support the Commuting Clergy. If funds are in hand it  
would be well to pay the debt at once. A rumour is kept  
up that Dr. Hinckes is to be Bishop of Kingston. The  
Bishop of Montreal is to settle the terms & regulations  
of his Synod: "all the colonies will get the start of  
the Mother Country in this move, but our turn will come."

1857      The great scheme of Commutation and the payment  
31 July of the Clergy from funds administered in the diocese  
London have almost put an end to official correspondence.  
Congratulations sent on obtaining a fair provision for  
the existing clergy; Mr. Cameron's plan promises well  
for growth of the number of clergy. Congratulations also  
sent on obtaining legal sanction for the Diocesan  
Synod and the subdivision of the Diocese; the Episcopate  
has been extended and a Bishop chosen by the free Voice  
of the Clergy and Laity, an example that will be  
followed in other colonies, and ultimately in England.  
Trusts that endowment will suffice to found another See  
in the Eastern Division.
