Joel Stone went from Washington to New York and joined the British Army 7th. Jany. 1777.

I took the small pox in Washington 15th. Feby. The same year I returned to Lemans some time the last of March. Daddies family all took the small pox at the time I came home except those which had it with me, which was Rene and Hannah.

Sometime in April 1778, Joel was taken on Long Island and carried to Fairfield goal. He wrote to Daddy and he and Leman went often to see him. Rene went to see him sometime in June the 15th. Hannah and I set out to go to see him (a line or so missing here) Woodbury where ^{Joel} unfortunately heard through mistake that he was at Hartford, went from Woodbury to Farrington, slept there that night, next morning we went into Hartford, found he was not there; but I was informed it was likely we could hear of him at Col. Williamses at Weatherfield, we went there but were still unfortunat, could hear nothing from him we went to a public house where we heard he was at Fairfield, we were very tyred and further from him than when at home; but still determined to see him we went to North plain where we slept that night.

The next morning we went to Newplain where we took breakfast and proceeded (1778 July 15th.) to about 10 miles beyond Old Milford where we dined at a down little house after dinner crossed the ferry and went to Stratford, from there to Fairfield, we went beyond the Goal to Mr. Demonds, we staid there till Mr. Woodruf went to the goal to see if Joel was there. He returned, said he was there but unwell and asleep, we went up to the house where he was for he had the liberty of the yard. He was walking, pensive and thoughtful backwards and forwards by the

door. He was asleep when Mr. Woodruff went to the house and did not know we were in town till he looked round and saw us and said my dear sisters

he could hardly speak and did not expect to see us, we went with him sat down by him and became exceedingly sociable, he got us wine and raisins and seemed anxious to divert us. Night came on he said he must go up stairs and be locked in prison. Oh, that dear brother. We went back to Demonds cried ourselves as asleep. Next day Joel went with us to Deeds. Faughs where we dined and after dinner came back to the Goal with Joel, we told him we wished to see where he lived or rather was obliged to lodge, it was with reluctance he complied with our request and went with us where he slept or kept.

December 1781. Leman is now at Litchfield busying himself about some Society affairs.

Last evening the Bethel Bucks and ladies came in a day to Mr. Linn. Harrison's, they sent for a fiddler gave my sister Huldah and I an invitation to go the Ball, we dressed and went late as it was, we had for company Charles Sheldon, John Feeling, Betsy Bellany and a number of other gentlemen and ladies.

We danced, some played some, and sung some, and so we spent our time till 10 or 12 o'clock and then we scattered.

Charles Sheldon was here to-day he is very sociable.

I dreamed the other night of being on a certain place where I had a full view of the of Connecticut, the place seemed high where I stood, and the prospect good.

I thought the groves looked green and the soil so far as I was Judge looked rich and fertile. I thought the country seemed mountainous and yet pleasant, clear streams of water running from vale to vale.

1779 Letter, Rene Stone, Hitchfield, to her brother, Joel
Stone, on personal matters. October, 1779.

1780 Letter, Joel Stone, New York, to his father, Stephen Stone, Litchfield, Conn., announcing his marriage to Leah Moore, daughter of Captain Wm. Moore. March 24, 1780.

Letter, Hannah, Huldah and Rachel Stone, Litchfield, to their brother, Joel Stone, New York, sending greetings. Mention in postscript that "Hans" is to marry Dr. Lemuel Hopkins. April 6, 1780.

Copy of Last Will & Testament of John Moore, Bombay, July 22, 1780.

Letter, Joel Stone, New York, to Capt'n Wm. Moore. Asks his permission to marry his daughter. August 28, 1780.

1781 Letter, Joel Stone to Capt. William Moore. Regrets his long absence from home and reports Capt. W's wife very ill. January 25, 1781.

Same to same, re same. Is anxious to have Capt. W's approval of his marriage to his daughter. January 26th, 1781.

Same to same, notifying him of the death of "our kind Mama". February 21, 1781.

Copies of two letters from John Blackburn, London, England, to Anthony Van Dam, concerning the estate of the late Commodore John Moore. October 13, 1781, and January 2nd, 1782.

1782 Letter, William Moore, Lisbon, to Joel Stone. Comments on the death of his (W.M.'s) wife and on the marriage of Joel Stone to W.M.'s daughter. States what arrangements he has made for them for the present. Is interested to hear he has a young grandson. February 21, 1782.

Copy of letter, Joel Stone to his father-in-law, William Moore, sending family news, telling of the birth of his son, William Moore Stone, and of W.M.'s son, John. May 10, 1782.

Letter, Rene Hopkins, Litchfield, to her brother, Joel Stone, on personal matters. October 29th, 1782.

Copy of letter, Joel Stone, New York, to his Brother. Is thankful to report his health restored. "I must inevitably go to England unless some unexpected turn of my business should take place" and wishes his wife and son might stay with his brother then. Has lost "a small sloop loaded with oysters, was drove of to sea in gail of wind, founder'd & the people lost" which has been a heavy loss to him. November 19, 1782.

1783 Letter, William Moore to his son-in-law, Joel Stone.
 Hopes he has received the legacy left to J.S.'s wife
 from W.M.'s late brother. Has just returned from a five
 months' voyage but an account of an accident is unable
 to make a remittance to New York. 1783.

Letter, Joel Stone, New York, to Mrs. Leah Stone, Bethpaig,
 at Wait Powel's. Has made arrangements for "John's"
 school. Is sending a parcel of books. Notes that the
 packet sails on Sunday. January 14, 1783.

Letter, Stephen Stone, Litchfield, to Joel Stone, New York.
 Sends family news. June 21, 1783.

Letter, H. Cremer van Zeller & Dohman, Lisbon, to Joel
 Stone, New York. Forward a letter from William Moore.
 Suggests that they can be of service to him (J.S.) in
 business purchases. August 16, 1783.

Letter, Lemah Stone, Litchfield, to his brother, Joel Stone,
 Great Britain. Reports on all he has done in securing
 documents, etc., concerning the estate of Joel Stone in
 the United States which will be needed in J.S.'s appeal
 before the Board of Commissioners in Great Britain for
 adjusting the Accounts of the Loyalists. December 2, 1783.
 In duplicate.

1784 Copy of letter, Joel Stone, London, England, to his wife. Asks her to send certain information necessary before her uncle's estate can be settled. In the meantime he is busy with his claim before Government and hopes that will be settled soon, when he plans to return to "some part of America". Has requested his brother to see that she has what she needs. January 24, 1784.

Authority from Joel Stone to Basil Horne, to proceed in the suit of Stone and others against Blackburn and others, in Chancery. January 24, 1784.

Letter, Joel Stone, London, to his brother, S. Stone. Begs him to see that his (J.S.'s) family receive every attention in his absence, and promises him ample compensation when he has secured settlement from the Government of his claim and secured his wife's legacy, of which he has "fare promises". Asks that certain documents be sent him. January 29, 1784.

Letter, Louisa Moore, Greenwich, to her mother, Mrs. Sandell, Mansion House. Wishes to know what she is to do for her holidays. June 12, 1784.

Copy of letter, L. Stone, Litchfield, to his brother, Joel Stone. Is greatly distressed to hear that Joel has not received letters and papers sent him but is forwarding copies of documents. Gives him information as to statutes dealing with confiscated estates in the United States. Comments on the changed situation in the States and his decision as to business. June 20, 1784.

Brief in the Chancery suit as to settlement of the estate of the late John Moore. June 28, 1784.

Letter, William Moore, London, to Dyer, Blackburn & White, authorizing them to pay to Joel Stone one half of his (W.M.'s) claim of £228: 14: 4, should they obtain this from Government. July 17, 1784.

Copies of two letters from Joel Stone to his wife, dated August 2, 1784, and July 15, 1784. Cannot understand why he has not heard from her. Is much interested to hear of the birth of his second son. Has not yet been successful in settling his business with Government or the matter of her legacy.

Copy of letter, Joel Stone to his father-in-law, William Moore. Acknowledges his cordiality since his arrival in England and his paternal benefactions. Trusts he has not forfeited his good will. February, 1784.

Letter, E. Moore, New York, to Joel Stone. Tells him of various letters, etc., sent him. Mentions new duties being placed on goods brought into New York State. February 24, 1784.

Affidavit of Charles Inglis and Thos. Crowell, both late of New York, as to the marriage of Joel Stone and Leah Moore. February 27, 1784.

Copy of letter sent by Joel Stone to the Lords of the Treasury, pointing out further losses, since his recent interview, and the destitute state of his family. February or March, 1784.

Letter, Joel Stone, London, to his wife. Is greatly distressed at not receiving letters and documents from her or his brother and urges that they be sent. April 9, 1784.

Notification to Mr. Stone to be present at the "Rools Office" for examination. May 10, 1784.

Letter, Louisa Moore, Greenwich, to her mother, Mrs. Sandell, Mansion House. Wishes to know what she is to do for her holidays. June 12, 1784.

Draft of letter, Joel Stone, London, to his father-in-law, William Moore. Is greatly perturbed to hear of the "necessitous situation" of his family. Reports on the delay in the Chancery suit. November 3, 1784.

Letter, Lewis Moore, New York, to Joel Stone, London. Acknowledges certain articles and advises him about bringing purchases into the country. Sends family news. November 5, 1784.

Letter, Joel Stone, London, to Mr. Atkins. Gives a sketch of his life, confiscation of his property, military service, and appeal to the Lords of the Treasury for redress. Is preparing a further petition for assistance in settling his family and hopes his friends will facilitate it. December 3, 1784.

1785 Copy of letters to Mr. & Mrs. Appleby from Joel Stone, as to progress of settlement of the estate of the late John Moore in which they are interested. February 5, 1785.

Letter, William Moore, New York, to Joel Stone, London. Reports Mrs. Stone's behaviour "most unaccountable" and wishes she were with her husband or that he could come to her. Has advised her going to New England. June 16, 1785.

Letter, Lemah Stone, Derby (?), to Joel Stone, London. Rejoices to hear that his prospects are so good. Asks what class he is considered, etc. August 28, 1785.

Letter, Leah Stone, New York, to Joel Stone, begging him to return to his family as she is in a miserable situation and very unhappy. September 26, 1785.

1786 Copy of letter, Joel Stone, London, to his brother (in-law) Points out that as his whole time practically has been given the Chancery suit in re the estate of the late John Moore, suggests that his "brother" share in his expenses. 1786.

Letter, Stephen Stone, Litchfield, to Joel Stone, England. Has not been able to trace the family genealogy as he requested. Reports "want of money, heavy rates, want in trade". March 22, 1786.

Letter, Joel Stone, London, to his father-in-law. Has just met Wm. Smith, late Chief Justice of New York, who is going out with Sir Guy Carleton, as Chief Justice of Canada, and who has suggested that Mrs. Stone and child put themselves under the patronage of Mrs. Smith for the journey from New York to Canada. Sends suggestions and advice for his wife. April 25, 1786.

Letter, Joel Stone, London, to Lewis Moore, re same. May 1, 1786.

Letter, William Moore, New York, to Joel Stone, London. Thinks he is entitled to 1/4 from the legatees. As soon as he hears he is established in Canada, will arrange for his wife and child to join him. Is anxious to know how the Chancery suit is progressing. May 6, 1786.

Letter, Joel Stone to the Commissioners of American Claims, concerning arrangements for transporting several Loyalists and their effects to Canada. May 15, 1786.

Same to same. Having made his arrangements to proceed to Canada on the Brig "Providence", where he plans to settle with his family, begs permission to go and to appoint Charles Cook his agent to attend to his pension, etc. July 24, 1786.

Letter, Lewis Moore, New York, to his brother, Joel Stone, concerning the percentage to be allowed Joel S. for expenses in re the Chancery suit of John Moore's estate; states that Mrs. Stone started for Canada alone, reached Albany and then returned, to await word of her husband's arrival in Canada. Takes up some financial matters and reports J.S.'s son has been put in a school in Hackensack. August 14, 1786.

Draft of letter, J. Stone, Quebec, to Chas. Cooke. Reports he arrived at Quebec on October 6th, after 51 days from Plymouth. Very favourably impressed by the country and its possible future. Has determined to pursue the distilling business but may need to draw on him for £100 to purchase more stock and arranges for J. Johnson to act as his agent in looking after the necessary securities, &c. Oct. 17, 1786. On other side, same to same. Tells of Lord Dorchester's arrival and happy reception. Again refers to the necessity of having to draw on him. October 25, 1786.

1787 Letter, Lewis Moore, New York, to Joel Stone, concerning the percentage to be allowed J.S. for expenses in re Chancery suit. Has not yet sold J.S.'s furniture. March 10, 1787.

Encloses copy of letter, dated February 27, 1787, reporting on his efforts to find a distiller. Has heard that he (L.M.) has a legacy in England and plans to go over.

Copy of letter, Joel Stone, New Johnstown, Canada, to Mr. Atkinson, concerning his account. April 5, 1787.

Letter, Lewis Moore, New York, to Joel Stone, straightening out Mr. Atkinson's account. Is happy to hear that J.S. has decided to settle in Johnstown. Cannot find some papers which are missing. Has sold J.S.'s bedstead and table for £5. April 9, 1787.

Encloses copy of his letter of March 10, 1787. (See above) and also copy of one of March 13th, 1787. Has arranged with Daniel McArthur to go to J.S. as a distiller.

Indenture of Apprenticeship, Robert Raymond to Samuel Carpenter, Linen Draper, London. April 16, 1787. Unsigned.

Note on back by Wm. M. Stone.

Draft of letter, J. Stone, Johnstown, to Daniel Jones, dealing with their applications for certain lands and water privileges, Isaac Ogden of Quebec, acting as their agent. May 1, 1787.

Letter, Rob't Appleby, Shelburne, to Joel Stone. Reports many families emigrating from Shelburne to America. Asks for information re conditions in Canada & if he could carry on his business there, for he plans to leave Shelburne as soon as he is out of gaol where he is confined for debts. Approves of J.S. receiving a percentage for his services in the Chancery suit. June 16, 1787.

Letter, Lewis Moore, London, to Joel Stone. Has arrived in England & tells of his reception there by various people & his first attempts at business. Reports stocks have fallen because of threats of a European war. July 22, 1787.
