Sept. 2?	3pp. Travelled to Oxford [Ontario], a total of 300 miles; gives place names and distance between travelled: New York - Peekskill, Pound Ridge, Fredericks town, Wappingers Creek, Albany, Sacandaga (along lake); Ontario - Newark [Niagara today?], Oxford, York [Toronto?]; Nov. 20 arrived at Newark.

March 1	Sap began to run
March 18	Started work on George's lot
March 20	Ground fit to plow; mosquitoes
April 18	Maple sap ran till 20 April
April 19	Began work on my lot
May 16	Began to clear George's lot
May 28	Planting starts; cleared till 27 May lots; Mr. Burdick started planting 25 May
June 5	Started chopping on my lot; usually plant between 30 May and 6 June
June 13	Done chopping my 5 acres, began clearing again on George's lot
June 15	Measured corn planted 3 May and 19 June and was 2 feet high; straightened levy up; corn growing so fast can see a difference from morning to night
July 5	This past week did 4 days on George's lot and 6 on mine; had laid up George's house 29 June and mine on 4 July; logs were 18 feet long; by end of July had finished fencing my lot; grew corn 12 Aug.; 2 recipes for rheumatism and salve
Oct. 16	Went on schooner "Mary"
Oct. 19	Set sail, commander Capt. "Robason" [Robinson?], stopped at "tarpolien cove" [Tarpaulin Cove, Mass. ?] 200 miles from York
Oct. 20	Set sail and by sunset over the shoals?
Oct. 21	Vessel laid to 3 hours
Oct. 22	Very hard day
Oct. 24	Made sail, set back again with the wind northwest
Oct. 25	Seen land, anchored at Cape Saint Mary's Bay
Oct. 26	Got up to the Mouth of Digby gut?
Oct. 27	Got to Digby in morning; top of next page: list of expenditures dated 1 Oct. 1801, examples include brandy, sugar, butter, passage to New York, gin, shirt; recipe for cough in horses dated July 12, 1805

Sept. 1	The 4 I left home; directly under this text is a list with prices, examples include silk handkerchief, book, shirt, survey Smith, cow, passage to York, Russel – receiver general

Aug. 9	Three weeks have done nothing; Aug. 5 went hunting with Mr. Cook, next night George I killed a buck weighing 120 lbs.

Aug. 12	Set off from Oxford [Ontario], stopped first day at John Youfers? at ?
Aug. 13	Travelled 31 miles, stopped at Ancaster [part of Hamilton, Ontario today]; went 91 miles and stayed at Able Stafford's
Aug. 15	Went 25 miles and stayed at ?
Aug. 16	At 23 miles hard three miles east of St. Lawrence River; stayed at house of Mr. Chapman
Aug. 17	Travelled 15 miles on "Bufalow" Road and stayed at house of Mr. "Rancom"
Aug. 18	Travelled 31 miles and stayed at house of ? "Seemoer Charles"
Aug. 19	Travelled 32 miles and stayed at house of "Worner"
Aug. 20	"Blomefield" "Canadocaway" [Ganonoque, Ontario?]; travelled 20 miles at house of "amsden"
Aug. 21	The "Geneva" went 25 miles; Mercer? House?
Aug. 22	23 miles travelled, stayed at the "anadogah hollor"
Aug. 23	29 miles, stayed at Gonges?

Aug. 26	Went 28 miles
Aug. 29	Went 12 miles to "skenacity" [Schenectady, New York] and George and me ?; 28 <sup>th</sup> had got to Uncle Arches [Archibald]
Oct. 7/9?	Left there
Oct. 14?	Got to New York, board of Lockwood? 2 days
Aug. 12	[first day of trip]; listing, examples – left silk handkerchief, 1 cow and calf in care of ? Burdick, 2 old woollen shirts, outside jacket and "westcot"
Sept. 6	Taken sick of fever; doctor's bill paid by Uncle Arch; fever ague and left me 19 Oct.; list of expenditures during his trip? – milk, bread, supper, lodging, whiskey; list of expenditures attached to places such as Niagara, Genesee River, Seneca

Jan. 1	Intended to take hay ride but can't due to ice problems
Jan. 3	Went up to Mr. Lyon's on the ice
Jan. 5	Ground all bare in the cleared land and river as clear? as ever seen
Jan. 11	Snow in improved land; mentions Joseph Lyons/Lyon, and a frolic at William's house
Jan. 17	Joel, Cate and Robert went to town and came back 18 <sup>th</sup>
Jan. 19	Most severe storm ever seen by me; Hary Lyon/Lyons and wife was here the 15 <sup>th</sup> ; mentions John and Sally
Jan. 23	G? "Goram"/Gorum/Gorham had hay frolic, I was there and had 6 teams
Jan 27	Stephen went to town and got pitch ? for his boat
Feb. 2	Capt John Lyons/Lyon, John and Peter Lyons/Lyon and wives were here
Feb. 5	James and Fanny? Crawford were here; Ham and Rache? went up the bay
Feb. 8	Jane and I went to town and came back the same day; Peter Lyon/Lyons went to "Shadeke" [Shediac?]
Feb. 12	Bates and Belding trial on account of the election
Feb. 11	Nancy Lyon/Lyons and my wife and I went out the 14 <sup>th</sup>
Feb. 13	Richard Whelpley had his frolic of hauling logs; he had 9 teams
Feb. 14	Went up to John Lyons/Lyon, Nancy Lyon/Lyons went with us
Feb. 15	Joseph went to town and back same day
Feb. 16	Mr. Brown had his hauling of logs to Jones mill, had 6 teams; I was there

Feb. 28	Mr. Brown went to town; James Crawford came up this way
March 2	Peter Lyon/Lyons came from Shediac; there was a dance here – proprietor Anderson Worden
March 4	Joseph Lyon/Lyons went to town and stayed overnight; mentions calves
March 7	<p>Joel and I went to church in my sleigh; 6<sup>th</sup> the court sat, fast day, court lasted till 9<sup>th</sup> then elections started at the court house</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leonard had the 1<sup>st</sup> day, 55 votes</li> <li>• Belding 145, Britton 23, Pitfield 15</li> </ul> <p>Election began 10<sup>th</sup> of March – Sat.; poll closed 12<sup>th</sup>; Leonard and Belding chosen as representatives</p>

March 22	Went to "Lundon's" [London's?] and got tea hooks? for the whipp ? trees; there were 17 hands
March 23	Stephen raising his wood boat, I was there
March 24	Benjamin White had chopping frolic, I was there; there were 10 Hands
March 26	Abraham Evens/Evans had chopping frolic; I not there
March 27	Robert Crawford went to town and back same day for his licences
March 28	Pete Force came to work at Stephen Bates; I was there with other hands to raise ?; 8 hands
March 29	Joel and Robert went to his wedding? in the sleigh; ice bad but nothing harmed
March 31	Turned Stephen's wood boat; he notes something fell but none hurt; 6 hands
April 4	Got boat up again, 7 hands
April 8	Went up to "farthers" on the ice and upset coming down the hill and "spilt us all out"
April 10	Stephen finished corking his boat; Joseph Lyon/Lyons had chopping frolic, I not there; 14 hands
April 12	John Williams went to town to overhaul his wood boat
April 13	Getting rails for line fence between John Williams and me; can split 80 or 90 and 20 stakes per day; believe started this first of April
April 14 - 15	River opened at Fosters Cove, earlier than normal
April 18	Joseph Lyon/Lyons and Britney Sofia? went to town and took calves for me
April 19	Ben white's spinning? Frolic
April 21	Stephen went to town for the first time this spring with Even's/Evan's wood
April 22	Easter Sunday – Jane and I went to church
April 24	Richard Whelpley moved his barn, had 14 yoke of oxen, 2 span of horses, 32 men
April 29	Stephen sold wood boat to Rothbone/Rothburn? and came up home
May 1 - 2	?
May 3	Ham and Stephen went to town and carried my calf; gives weight
May 9	Began to sow wheat and plant potatoes
May 2	John Britney had dam? frolic?; Mrs. Britney had spinning of tea?
May 8	Drove up young cattle to upper lot to pasture
May 14	Brown mare folded – this colt Stephen had
May 17	Began to make line fence between Williams and me, finished 24 <sup>th</sup>
May 25	Planted corn 24 <sup>th</sup> ; Hanford Bostwick went to town and carried 6 dozen eggs for me
May 26	Mr. Sealy/Seely came from England
May 27	Bill Williams went with another – Gorum's/Gorham's wood; Joseph Lyon/Lyons went to town with Pat Brown and James thane and came back 30 June
June 1	I quit fishing; sowed my oats; Mr. Sealy/Seely came home to the Point
June 2	Mr. Brown complains of roads being shut? up on our upper lot and father's
June 6	Started planting potatoes, finished 11 <sup>th</sup>
June 9	Joel moved up to his place from Sealy's/Seely's Point
June 15	Stephen had his colt; mentions sheep
June 19	Sowed buckwheat

June 21	Stephen went to town with Mr. Brown, got me a hat
July 1	Brindle cow calved 2 bull calves
July 3	General muster at Seth Seely's
July 6	Worked on the roads at the bridge; hear Samuel Nichols highway Master, 10 hands first day, 1 team; 8 the next day the 9 <sup>th</sup> , next time 10 hands 1 team, next day 8 hands, 1 team; last highway work before haying?
July 9	Our people had braking? wool frolic, that is at fathers; began to hoe potatoes and finished 14 <sup>th</sup>
July 17	Went down to Purdy's, mentions something about a fine concerning Capt. Purdy and the capt. being upset
July 16	James and Faney came down here
July 21	Catherine's first sending for Mr. Britney; Robert and Molly went up bay with little Rachel and came back 23 <sup>rd</sup> ; Mr. Hail/Hale came too
July 23	Harrowed my turnips in Grassy Island, sold at Thomas Seely's by Judge Coffin
July 24	Daniel loaded Scribner's boat?; they had 25' cords
July 30	Betsey Williams came here to work; Jane and Betsey went up to carding mill with our wool
Aug. 3	Got the woollen
Aug. 4?	Have old and new potatoes
Aug. 15	Joel's child born – Catherine
Aug. 13	Got the Andrew cow from Stephen
Aug. 14	Stephen turned their bull in the upper lot with our heffers
Aug 20	Went to town with butter and mutton for Joel; our people came back 21 <sup>st</sup> ; got sick for 3 or 4 days
Aug. 23	Began to cut my wheat; Joel had mowing frolic
Aug. 31	Joseph Lyon/Lyons had frolic
Sept. 1	Weaned twin calves
Sept. 7	Stephen went to town; Brown and Dick went same day
Sept. 11	Stephen got his colt home that he got from me
Sept. 13	Joel and Sam Holder went to town with mutton and butter
Sept. 17	Our people bought White's farm
Sept. 12	Got our rams away from ewes; Robert went to town and came back 1 <sup>st</sup> ; sold five lambs for me
Sept. 24	Began to cut my buckwheat, done 2 <sup>th</sup>
Sept. 26	John Perkins and wife came here; Perkins, Joseph and George Lyon/Lyons went to town and came back 28 <sup>th</sup>
Oct. 2	Joel and Mr. Seely's son went to town with mutton
Oct. 4	Daniel went to town with his wood with Scribner's boat, got back 12 <sup>th</sup> ; they lost ?; got my buckwheat in and threshed
Oct. 6	Done hay mowing, hauled in last of hay 12 <sup>th</sup>
Oct. 10	With Robert went to town with my heffer and 6 sheep
Oct. 12	Started digging potatoes
Oct. 13	Worked on roads for last day
Oct. 16	Rachel Bulyea/Belyea came to work
Oct. 19	Weather
Oct. 28	Joseph Benedict Crawford born about 6:00 in the morning
Oct. 30	Finished digging potatoes – 200 bushels
Oct. 31	"Maskeline's"/Mascaline's trial; began to pull turnips

Nov. 5	Daniel and Ham went to town with mutton and beef, came back 8 <sup>th</sup>
Nov. 8-9	Training at Holder's the young ones

Nov. 20	Robert and Stephen worked on roads from Sealy's/Seely's to the Kennebecasis River
Nov. 19	Sowed rye; had a raffle here, Miss Lyon/Lyons came
Nov. 17	Finished pulling turnips
Nov. 21	Harrowed rye
Nov. 22	Rachel Belyea went away for nursing; Betsey Williams married
Nov. 27	Stephen went to town with beef and mutton; back 28 <sup>th</sup>
Nov. 29	Joel went to town with his cow and hogs
Nov. 28?	Sold my hog to ? for 5d per lb. that weighed 220 lbs
Nov. 30	Joseph Lyon/Lyons and James thane went down to town, came back 8 Dec.
Dec. 1	Highway fence – almost done
Dec. 2	Went to father's on horseback with little ones
Dec. 5	Snowstorm, no snow since 11 of Nov.
Dec. 7	River beginning to ice up; Tom Fitzgerald and others skated on the river though it is not half frozen up
Dec. 12	Two men crossed the river between Rocky Island and foster's upper island
Dec. 16	Ice hard, people on with horse and sleighs
Dec. 20	Stephen and mother came in the sleigh and went sleigh riding together, my first sleigh riding
Dec. 24	Ice good so crossed with my team straight to Foster's mill; Christmas day went to church
Dec. 27	To town and back the same day
Dec. 28	Snow off the cleared land

Jan. 5	Gorum/Gorham had hay hauling, had 7 teams; snowy day
Jan. 8	Bill Williams married
Jan. 12	James and Faney Crawford came from town and stopped here
Jan. 13	Went to church, "the one Sunday after epiphany"; got our boy Joseph Benedict baptised
Jan. 14	Very cold, many sled went past on the way to Grassy Island
Jan. 15	James Moor's horse race with Sam Holder; I went to Jacob Bulyea's for shad?
Jan. 27	Preached upon the sacrament – Parson Schofield's text – Luke, 14 <sup>th</sup> chapter, 18 <sup>th</sup> verse; Feb. 10 - Titus 2 chapter 8 verse; March 6? – Joshua 24 chapter 15
Jan. 16	Fine going on land and ice
Jan. 17	Sold old sow to Mr. Broad, weighed 203 lbs at 5 d per lb; Robert and Mary Crawford went to town
Jan. 18	John and Martha Crawford came here; Daniel Crawford and Hamlin swapped – Dan his horse for Ham's stags and one sheep
Jan. 20	Stephen Crawford went up to John Crawford's, carried up Martha
Jan. 22 & 24	Ground covered with ice
Jan. 25	Weather

Jan. 26-27	Went to church; was up to Ham's
Jan. 30	Hamlin and Rachel here, father and mother here; went up to Mr. Mervin's to quit a deed and give obligation; Daniel Crawford got Ham's stags; John Williams went to town with sleigh; daughter came back 31 <sup>st</sup>
Jan. 31	Daniel and father went to town for money?; they got "50 lb"
Feb. 1	They got back, had my horses
Feb. 4	Weather
Feb. 5	Went to Broad's frolic of ?; Mr. Brown and I got back the same day
Feb. 7	Very pleasant, went to Richard Whelpley's at night for a visit
Feb. 8	Brom? Belyea and wife here; ? Lyon/Lyons here; Daniel married?
Feb. 12	Training to Sealy's/Seely's
Feb. 15	Training at Sealy's/Seely's
Feb. 14	Last day of officers' drilling; Mrs. Jones here; Mrs. Ganong and H? Lyon/Lyons went home
Feb. 15	Weather
Feb. 17	Mary Robert "sent out"
Feb. 18-22	Weather
Feb. 21	Went to Abraham Belyea's; went to Broad's and got my axes, settled with Broad for the sow
Feb. 22	Carried up soap for Mrs. Lyon/Lyons
Feb. 23	Weather
Feb. 24	Davis and wife at Fanny's?
Feb. 25	William Sealy's log frolic; killed my old ewe?
Feb. 26	"our people" carried up 2 loads of their things; Daniel and Clary here, sled? at night
Feb. 27	Joseph and George Gorum/Gorham are to town
Feb. 28	Mary's child born at night – Margaret
March 4	Heffer calved a bull calf
March 6	Fast day; pleasant, went to church with Joel and Kate; his child baptised
March 7	Weather
March 9	Court broke up; heard? rom Charles and James Theal – very heavy going on the river
March 11	James Williams and boys to work at Joel's?
March 14?	?
March 15	Jane and I went to John Williams; warm day, river open down to the little island
March 19	"our people" went up to the Marvin farm, pleasant
March 20	Got my hay from Richard Whelpley
March 23	Nancy had her ? ?, four year old
March 24	Went up to Roberts in the sleigh, ice very bad, White's horse got in a crack; rain storm 3 days; river broke down to the lower end of Caton's Island – last time anyone went on the ice
March 27	Got my orders to ?
March 28-29	Got red heffer calved
March 30	Went up to Squire Pickel's?

April 4	? cow calved
April 6	Went up to Mr. "Ranants" to make up the poor rates, shows some rates
April 12	Joel gone to church
April 14	Sunday went to church, very bad going; river opened up last night
April 15	Joel went to town and carried a calf for me; went to church for vestry meeting; river was open
April 18	Ben White raised his barn; "Little Josey would stan on my hand when he was 3 months old, when he was 5 months he would set a lone"
April 20	Richard Whelpley raised his house; frogs sung
April 21	James Theal stayed the night, he was after Henry Whelpley to build a boat
April 22	Sent after the money?; building fence south of upper barn
April 24	Began plowing upper lot, sowed wheat there
April 25	Mother came down to Hamlin's with Robert
April 27	Joel sowing his wheat; my 2 old cows calved
April 29	Holder raised his barn
April 30	Miss Bates here
May 1	"Oh what a time this was", laid out the roads/rows? to sow my wheat
May 8	Stephen took my calves to town; Sam Nichols raised his barn
May 9	Stephen came back
May 10	Drove up calves to upper lot
May 11	Finished sowing wheat
May 13	Father, Williams and Holder went to ?, sent 22 lbs of butter to town
May 14	Barton's raft? broke; began to plow buckwheat
May 15	Went to Broad's to get my shears sharpened; Arabian? Horses wanted Rachel to spin?
May 19	Weather
May 21	M. J. began planting potatoes; "dreadful uprore" among the women against father respecting old Mr. Nichols
May 24	Judge Picket and father at Sam Nichols to settle with Unes?; planted my corn
May 25	Mr. Dibble came and surveyed the roads; Mr. Lyon's ox dropped dead
May 27	Mend up the school house; sheared my sheep
May 28	School started; Mr. Evens/Evans went over the river with his horse
June 1	Williams and Holder met at Sealy's/Seely's to hire men to work on the road?
June 3	Nancy started school
June 4	Finished planting potatoes, it's been a good season to plant and sow
June 7	Went to town with butter, got 4 bushels of corn at 7 s per batch, a barrel of rye flour for 9.5 ?, came back same night
June 10	Henry Evens/Evans here to go ?
June 11	Fencing my buckwheat, began 10 <sup>th</sup>
June 12	Went down to Mr. Hays? for Bob's and John's guns
June 14	Mother, Rachel and Mary here
June 15	Peas blossomed on upper lot
June 17	Rachel Belyea came to work; I went to Mr. Rice's for milk pans
June 19	Sowed buckwheat
June 21	To town and back in 24 hours with butter; got Jane a new hat, gives price

June 29	James Williams Lanckin? – wood boat; planted early potatoes
July 1	Judge Williams and Holder started work on winter road, finished 5 <sup>th</sup>
July 2	Court at Kingston, returned by road
July 6	Work done on winter road from Long Reach to Kennebecasis River; 30 pounds given by government to mend; includes a list of people and the amount of days worked: Robert Belyea, Abraham Bulyea, Luis Fraser, William Laskey, Anderson Worden, Asa Cronk, Joel Crawford, James Moor/Moore, William Williams, John Giggy, Jacob Holder, William Bulyea, Isaac Heaveland, Oliver Laskey, Jacob Laskey, Henry Cronk, Henery Holder, Benjamin Crawford, John Curry, Ben White, John Williams
July 8-9	Began to hoe potatoes; Stephen went to Foxes? probably about his boat; Joel carried butter from me to town with Mrs. Seely, 52.5 a calf for Mrs. Sealy/Seely, weight shown and amount money gotten

July 13	Started work on road on my upper lot; Joel surveyor of roads
July 14	Went to church and Rachel Bulyea/Belyea
July 15	Sam Holder went to town and took 23 lbs of butter for me; got back 17 <sup>th</sup>
July 17	Went to James Whelpley's to get our L? wove?
July 19	Worked on roads down Mr. Nichol's bank beyond the brook
July 20	Finished hoeing potatoes; roads done to Mr. Brown's lot
July 21	Cherry's ripe
July 23	Weather
July 25	Training at Mr. Seely's; Col. Gubbins inspector of the militia
July 27	Hamlin and Rachel visiting
July 31	New potatoes got
Aug. 1	Weather
Aug. 2	Stephen Crawford went down for his wood boat; bad hay weather
Aug. 3	Lots of fog
Aug. 5	Rachel Belyea done work and went home; James Moor/Moore married Rachel Holder; foggy
Aug. 6	Weather
Aug. 8	Joseph Lyon/Lyons went to town with wood; Joel and I went up to help father with his rye; finished mowing little lot next to the brook
Aug. 11-12	Growing weather – rain
Aug. 13	Joel went to town with mutton
Aug. 14	Stephen came up with his wood boat; Joel returned – shows money got for mutton
Aug. 15	Reaped rye on upper lot; Joseph Lyon/Lyons came from town, was down with his wood and bark
