- 1st District Meeting in Halifax on 5 May 1826. George Jackson and R. William as chairmen.
- Published in the form of Question and Answer.
- Content includes:
 - Preachers present, absent (includes notes why), and dead.
 - Candidates for missionaries.
 - Names of preachers, where they presently minister, and where they will minister in the future.
 - Demarcation lines between the New Brunswick and Nova Scotia Districts.
 - Number of persons in associated societies
 - Includes whites, and free coloured persons (blacks)
 - Mission properties in chapels and dwelling houses now and to be built.
 - o Finances
 - Sunday School
 - Town/villages not visited and reasons why.
 - Useful measures to preach to children. This includes what is done catechizing children in each station.
 - Preachers wishing to return home and their reasons why.
 - Religious state of societies available in the appendices¹
