During this period DesBarres employed several agents for different periods and various purposes. These were his sons, James Luttrell and Augustus; his daughter, Amelia; his son-in-law, Robert Chalmers; and John Macdonald, whose report of 1795 is in DesBarres Papers, Series 2. Several lawyers were engaged in connection with ejectments, lawsuits, trespass, and similar matters arising from confusion which had arisen under Mary Cannon's management. Another serious problem was caused by the failure to register the Memramcook and Petitcodiac grant in New Brunswick when that colony was created in 1784. In these circumstances the letters are listed by correspondent without a subject analysis.

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LAND CORRESPONDENCE, 1813-1824

DesBarres was pensioned in 1812. He went to Amherst to take over the management of his estates. He had assistance from his daughter Isabella, his sons, James and Augustus, while James Morse acted under authority from James DesBarres who was sent to England in 1813 to petition the British Government against the decision of the New Brunswick government as to the Memramcook and Petitcodiac estates and to press his father's claims for recognition of his services and additional payment for his work in publishing the Atlantic Neptune. DesBarres left Amherst in 1817 to settle at Halifax where he died in 1824.
