Volume I 1784 -1790

The Despatches from the year 1784 (the foundation of the Province) until Sir Howard Douglas' appointment in 1824 were kept for many years in a box in the Provincial Secretary's office, where they suffered much, from dirt, neglect and the curiosity of chance visitors. By order of Lieutenant-Governor Gordon they were transferred to Government House in 1864, and at his request were arranged, indexed and prepared for the binder by Captain Harry Moody, his ADC and Private Secretary, by whom also all the "Despatches Received" up to the end of 1865, and "Despatches Sent" up to October 1861 (after which date they were copied into a book) were arranged and bound.

1784 - 1790

Colonel Thomas Carleton appointed Captain General and Governor in Chief August 21, 1784; in July 1786 appointed Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Guy Carleton (afterwards Lord Dorchester) having been appointed Captain-General and Governor in Chief of all the British North American Colonies.
