Volume VI 1821-1824 Major General George Stacey Smyth died on 27 March 1823. The senior member of the Council, Mr. Leonard, declining on account of his age to assume the Government, and the next member Mr. Billings being unable to attend at Fredericton, Mr. Ward Chipman assumed the administration of the Government on 1st April 1828. He died on 9th February 1824, and was succeeded by Mr. John M. Bliss--who was supersceded by the arrival of Major General Sir Howard Douglas Bail as Lieutenant Governor, on 28the August 1824.
