## A D D R E S S E S.

### To the King.

I. (10 Sess. A. 1777.)—

REQUESTING he will be pleased to order the commander of the squadron on the station to keep a sufficient number of armed vessels cruising about the island, for the protection of the coast and trade, address and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 17; prepared; committed; considered; reported, *ibid.*; read; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence, 18; agreed to by them; house inform them of the blanks being filled up; the lieutenant-governor desired to transmit it, 19.

II. (12 Sess. A. 1778.)—Expressing their concern that the island has been for some time past left in a defenceless situation, for want of a proper squadron of ships of war on the station, and that his majesty would be pleased to send out a proper naval armament to protect them, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 77; prepared; committed; considered; reported, 78; read; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence; agreed to by them; house inform them of the blanks being filled up, 79; the governor desired to transmit it, 80; message to him respecting the sending it, *ibid.*

III. (*Ibid.*)—Setting forth the great want of all kinds of military stores, and beseeching his majesty to grant them a necessary supply, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 108; prepared; committed, 120; considered, 121, 122; reported, 122; read, 123; passed; the governor desired to transmit it, 124.

IV. (13 Sess. A. 1779.)—Praying for relief from the very distressing duty of five per cent. lately imposed on the neat produce of the customs and excise, address and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 139; prepared; committed, 141; considered; reported, 142; read; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence, *ibid.*; agreed to by them; house inform them of the blanks being filled up; the governor desired to transmit it, 143.

V. (14 Sess. A. 1779.)—On the subject of a letter from the secretary of state (v. *Addresses*, III.), and representing the great distress brought on the country by the expences incurred during the late martial law, and requesting his majesty will be pleased to grant an aid for their relief; and to order a supply of military stores, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 187; prepared; committed; considered; reported, 189; read, *ibid.*; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence, 190; message from them that they cannot concur therein; the governor desired to transmit it, 197.

VI. (15 Sess. A. 1780.)—Representing the great distress the island labours under, from the scarcity of circulating coin, and praying that his majesty will be pleased to give orders that the British pay of the troops sent out may be remitted in cash, for a limited time; address and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 232; instruction to insert a clause requesting an aid from government for alleviating the public distresses occasioned by the late expences and increase of taxes; address and petition prepared; committed; considered; reported, 236; read; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence; agreed to by them; house inform them of the blanks being filled up; the governor desired to transmit it, 238.

VII. (16 Sess. A. 1780.)—Representing the situation of the judges in the island, and praying his majesty will be pleased to give his assent to a bill to render the office of a judge of the supreme court more permanent and respectable; representation resolved on, *nem. con.*; committee appointed to prepare it, 331.

VIII. (*Ibid.*)—Implying him to give effectual directions that all such troops which he shall be pleased to send for the protection of the colony, and actually receive the island subsistence, shall not, in future, be sent off to answer any other purposes, except by his majesty's express orders, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 337.

IX. (17 Sess. A. 1781.)—Respecting the judges and the sending the troops stationed here upon foreign expeditions (v. *Addresses* VII. VIII.), petition and address resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 355; prepared; committed; considered; reported; read; passed; the governor desired to transmit it, 356.

X. (1 Sess. A. 1781.)—Representing that however desirous the assembly are to keep the forts and fortifications in a state of defence, and to contribute towards the subsistence of the troops stationed in the island, yet the distresses of the people, aggravated by the additional duties laid by parliament on their staple commodity, may in future disable them from raising the sums necessary for such purposes, and entreating his majesty will condescend to take such measures as shall obtain for them the necessary relief, address and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 378; prepared; committed, 380; considered; reported; read; passed; the governor desired to transmit it, 381.

XI. (2 Sess. A. 1781.)—Representing the distresses of the island under the duty imposed by parliament upon sugars, and praying to be relieved from the same, as the house, without such relief, cannot provide for the subsistence of the troops after a certain time, memorial and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 403; prepared, 407; committed; considered; reported, 411; passed; the governor desired to transmit it, 412.

XII. (6 Sess. A. 1782.)—Stating matters with regard to an additional duty imposed by parliament upon different articles of customs and excise, and also respecting an act of parliament permitting the produce of the islands captured by the enemy to be imported, in neutral bottoms, into Great-Britain, memorial and petition resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it, 553; prepared; committed; considered; reported, 566; read; passed, and sent to the council for their concurrence, 567; agreed to by them; house inform them of the blanks being filled up, 568; the governor desired to transmit it, 581.

### To the Lieutenant-Governor.

XIII. (10 Sess. A. 1777.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 3; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, 4; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that it is with uncommon regret they think on the death of sir Basil Keith; that in him they behold one, whom they know by experience to be well able to supply his loss and to give satisfaction to the community; and that they shall proceed to business with unanimity and as much dispatch as the constitution will admit of; passed; his honour appoints to be attended; his answer, 5.

### To the Governor.

XIV. (11 Sess. A. 1778.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 67; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, *ibid.*; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that the assurance he gives, by command of his majesty, that, in case of a war, they shall receive every protection that can be afforded, and the squadron on the station considerably reinforced, must fill their minds with gratitude; that they shall engage with ardour in promoting means of defence; and that, apprized as they are of the necessity of the revival of the militia laws, recommended by him, they shall enter into the investigation of that subject; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 68.

XV. (12 Sess. A. 1778.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 73; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, 74; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that they observe, with concern, that hostilities have been commenced on the part of France; which, with the alarming state of public affairs, determined him, with the advice of a council of war, to proclaim martial law; that the alacrity with which they passed a vote of credit, the last session, to enable him to put the island into a state of defence, and the power given him to lay out the money, demonstrate not only their readiness on all occasions to grant as liberally as the distressed state of the country will admit, but also the high confidence they have in his disposal of it; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 75.

XVI. (12 Sess.

*To the Governor; continued.*

XVI. (12 Sess. A. 1778.)—Thanking him for his ready compliance with the desire of the house in taking off martial law, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 138; address prepared, 139; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that they shall make such a provision for the 79th regiment as has been usual for his majesty's forces; and they trust that, under his wife and prudent conduct of the public works, money will be saved sufficient to answer that end, without laying additional burthens on their constituents; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 88.

XVII. (13 Sess. A. 1779.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 138; address prepared, 139; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that they shall make such a provision for the 79th regiment as has been usual for his majesty's forces; and they trust that, under his wife and prudent conduct of the public works, money will be saved sufficient to answer that end, without laying additional burthens on their constituents; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 140.

XVIII. (14 Sess. A. 1779.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 145; address prepared, 146; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that while they feel, with concern, the necessity he was under of laying on and continuing martial law by his own authority, they must applaud his care of the constitution in having it again proclaimed, as speedily as could be, in the usual manner; and, that every assistance may be given at this important crisis, they request he will call forth such persons as he shall deem capable of taking the command of the grand divisions of the militia, and to give them proper commissions to enable them to take such command; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 147.

XIX. (*Ibid.*)—To appoint a chief justice, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; prepared, 182; read; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 183.

XX. (15 Sess. A. 1780.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, 227; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that the arrival of the 88th regiment, with an ample supply of military stores, impresses them with the liveliest sensations of gratitude, which it is their wish to evince, by making an immediate and adequate provision for its support; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 229.

XXI. (*Ibid.*)—Representing that, amidst the calamities of war, which has extended its operations to the neighbouring islands, how much it behoves the assembly to request that the troops stationed for the defence of the island, or any of the white inhabitants, or people of colour, be not sent off upon foreign expeditions, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; prepared, 236; read; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 237; address and answer to be published in the newspapers, 238.

XXII. (16 Sess. A. 1780.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 247; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, 249; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that with the deepest concern they feel for the distresses of their fellow-citizens in the parishes of Westmorland and Hanover; and that they shall adopt every measure, that the circumstances of the country will admit of, for their relief; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 250.

XXIII. (17 Sess. A. 1781.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred; address prepared, 354; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that they deliberated before the late prorogation upon the means of adding greater dignity to the judicial authority; the result of those deliberations appeared, by a bill for giving permanency to the office of the judges of the supreme court and the justices of assize, which, to their great concern, failed in the council; that they intend again to take it into consideration, and are in hopes it will meet with the concurrent sanction of all the branches of the legislature; passed, 355; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 356.

XXIV. (1 Sess. A. 1781.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 364; address prepared; committed; considered; reported, 369; read, 370; expressing thanks for the speech; that they are to inform him that, previous to the discussion of the usual business of the house, they have taken into their consideration a subject in which the privileges of the house are involved; that they have, by their resolutions, asserted their rights, and do protest against any right of the crown to interfere or judge of the return of the writs of election; that they trust that the papers which are laid before them will shew the extent of the humanity now exercised by the British parliament, and the end it was intended to accomplish; that, as the faith of the island has been pledged to provide for the 99th regiment and corps of artillery, they shall accordingly vote them a temporary subsistence; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 371.

XXV. (2 Sess. A. 1781.)—For his speech at opening the

session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 384; address prepared; committed, 385; considered; reported; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that they regret extremely that the means already devised to advance the credit of the island pay-bills have been inadequate to those purposes; they shall not, however, fail to benefit by his recommendation of that important object, or to adopt whatever measure may be judged the best calculated to promote and attain it; passed; his excellency appoints to be attended; his answer, 386.

*To the Lieutenant-Governor.*

XXVI. (3 Sess. A. 1781.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred, 417; address prepared, 418; committed; considered; reported; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that his appointment to the government gives them real satisfaction; that they are truly concerned for the mortality and sickness of the troops, but are persuaded his majesty has been thoroughly informed of all the causes thereof; passed, 419; his honour appoints to be attended; his answer, 420.

XXVII. (4 Sess. A. 1782.)—For his speech at opening the session, resolved on; committee appointed to prepare it; speech referred; address prepared; committed, 453; considered; reported; read, expressing thanks for the speech; that the alarming military preparations of their enemies, they hope, will prove a powerful incentive to the zeal of his majesty's subjects, and create a vigour adequate to all the purposes of defence; passed; his honour appoints to be attended; his answer, 456.

XXVIII. (5 Sess.
