BOTSFORD, Amos

Amos Botsford (1744-1812) was a native of Connecticut. With Samuel Cummings, Frederick Hauser and James Peters, he served as agent for the settlement of Loyalists in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. From 1785 until his death he was a member of the New Brunswick Assembly, and its Speaker. His son William Botsford (1773-1864) was a member of the Assembly from 1812, Speaker and Solicitor General from 1817 until 1823, when he was named to the Supreme Court bench. He retired in 1854.

Finding Aid No. 525 provides a descriptive-list-of-the-items-in-chronological order.

The papers accumulated by Amos and William Botsford, 1752-1839, consist of correspondence, notes, land records and related papers arranged in five subject files: correspondence (pages 1-88), records of Loyalist settlements (pages 89-172), land grants (pages 173-177), miscellaneous memoranda and notes (pages 178-296) and judicial commissions (pages 297-307). The divisions were not strictly observed in the arrangement of the papers and some pages were not numbered in the first sequence so there are in fact some 350 pages in the collection.
