The collection was presented to the P.A.C. in 1916 by the Delancey-Robinson family and then included the papers of Thomas Baillie (MG 24, B 45); George Bliss (MG 24, B 23), Sir Archibald Campbell (MG 24, A 21), and Sir William M.G. Colebrooke (MG 24, A 3).

Finding Aid No. 298 provides a list of contents of volumes 1-4, and a detailed description of the documents found in files 2, 4-16.

Volumes 1 and 2 contain unbound documents concerning political affairs, social history and economic development in New Brunswick, as well as the minute book of the committee for the relief of sufferers of the fires of October 1825.

Volume 3 contains the minute book of the New Brunswick Agricultural and Emigrant Society, 1825-1830, while volume 4 is the mess book of the 1st Company, 74th regiment, kept by Sergt. T. Mullins, 1815-1818.
