John Graves Simcoe entered the British Army in 1771. After his promotion to major in 1777, he took command of the newly-formed provincial corps called the Queen's Rangers, becoming its lieutenant colonel in 1778 and colonel in 1781. Invalided home in 1781, he spent ten years quietly in Devon until named the first Lieutenant-Governor of Upper Canada, which post he took up in 1792. He was transferred to Santo Domingo for 1796-1797, then returned to England. Shortly before his death in 1806 he was appointed Commander-in-Chief of India.

Simcoe married Elizabeth Posthuma Gwillim in 1782 and they had eleven children.

The Simcoe papers were received from a variety of sources from 1881-1962.

No Restriction on Access.

Finding Aid No. 139 provides subject and nominal lists for Series 1, 3 and 4 of the transcripts as well as a detailed description of Series 5. Series 1 and 2 include tables of contents within the volumes of the two series. The tables of contents are arranged chronologically by year, and contain the date of the document, its page number in the series, and a description of its contents. The finding aid for Series 5 contains a list of authors, recipients, and dates and descriptions of documents on reels A-605 to A-608. Finding Aid No. 178, consists of two chronologically organized lists of despatches from the Colonial Office to the Governor in Chief of Lower Canada and the Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada for the period 1784-1841. It includes many references to the Simcoe papers.

The papers of John Graves Simcoe include both public and private correspondence, memoranda and military records, as well as family papers, and diaries. Included are correspondence of his father, Captain John Simcoe, RN, and of his wife Elizabeth Posthuma Gwillim, as well as of his daughters Eliza Katherine, Charlotte, Harriet, Caroline, Anne and Sophie. The papers are arranged in series according to the sources from which they were copied.

Part of the Simcoe correspondence has been published by Cruikshank, in five volumes between 1923 and 1931, available in the National Archives Library. Mrs. Simcoe's diary and many of her sketches have also been published. Instead of relying on the originals, Cruikshank used the "error-ridden transcriptions which had been made under the direction of John Ross Robertson in the 1880s." This statement appeared in an article by E.G. Firth, "The Publication of Documents in Canada," Canadian Archivist, Vol. 1, No. 5 (1967), pp 12-15.

Series 1: Coventry transcripts. Transcript, 1789-1806, 0.230 m. (Vol. 1-6).

In 1860, George Coventry transcribed selected material from documents lent by the Rev. Henry A. Simcoe and compiled a detailed table of contents for each volume of transcripts as well as a "catalogue", now in volume 1. The transcripts were received in 1881. Further transcripts and some original documents are to be found among the George Coventry papers, MG 24, K 2.

The original Simcoe papers were purchased from the Simcoe family in 1946 and deposited in the University of Toronto Library until 1952, when they were placed in the Archives of Ontario.

Series 2: Robertson transcripts. Transcript, 1789-1806, 0.280 m. (Vol. 1-13).

In 1907, John Ross Robertson made typescript copies of the Coventry transcripts, including the tables of contents. The transcripts, bound up as 13 "Books" or volumes, were received in 1927—1929 from Robertson's estate.

Series 3: Wolford papers. Transcript, 1746-1824, 0.410 m. (Vol. 1-11).

In 1906-1908, John Ross Robertson made typescript copies from original documents made available by Mrs. John K. Simcoe of Wolford, Devon. The volumes, again, labelled "Books" were subsequently received in the Archives from Robertson's estate. Of note are two volumes entitled "Vessels, Marine Department, Upper and Lower Canada, 1776-97" and "Public Accounts, Upper Canada, 1792-96" (books 10-11).

Additional Simcoe papers. Transcript, 1784-1802, 0.760 m. (Vol. 1-8).

Between 1927 and 1930, transcripts were made from original documents then in the possession of Willoughby Cole of Southampton, U.K. The papers are arranged under the designations Packets A-A18, C-Z, Aa-Zz; Bundles I-VII; and volumes I-XXX. These documents had not been included in earlier series of transcripts.

Microfilm, 1775-1861, 4 reels, A-605 Simcoe papers in Devon. to A-608. Photocopy, 1765-1860, 3 pages.

In 1962, the Simcoe papers in the Devon Record Office, Exeter, England, were microfilmed for the National Archives of Canada. The documents are arranged in 40 numbered folders, most folders containing more than one document. No. 11 was copied as photostats. The following is a brief description of the contents of the four reels: Reel A-605 consists of despatches, correspondence, printed military regulations, coded letters, speeches, addresses, lists of officers, memorials, petitions, reports, extracts of documents, maps, journals, general orders and returns relating to the military and political career of John Graves Simcoe, in Upper Canada and in Santo Domingo, and his return to England, 1775-1806, 1861. Included is material on the relations of the Six Nations with the British government and the American government, as well as material on Joseph Brant.
