- F1-1 Letter from John Saunders [London] to Mrs. Jacob Ellegood, Rose Hall, Princess Anne County, Virginia. C.1785. Saunders tells his sister of a possible move to New Brunswick. Other names: Peggy, Parker. [Part of the letter is missing].
- F1-2 Statement of account. Jacob and [John] Worthy [London] to Jacob Ellegood. 18 July 1785. Other names: William Hudson.
- F1-3 Statement of account. George Jeremy, linen draper [London] to [Jacob Ellegood]. 17 February 1786.
- F1-4 Receipt. John Rogers, Jr. [Saint John] to Jacob Ellegood. 24 February 1786. 19 pounds and 12 shillings for sundry woolens.
- F1-5 Fragment of a shipping invoice. Harrison Ansley & Co., London, to [Jacob Ellegood]. 24 February 1789. Invoice paid on [28] March 1789. Other names: James Parker.
- F1-6 Power of Attorney form re Loyalist claim for compensation. Jacob Ellegood, Fredericton, NB, to (no name). 1791.
- F1-7 Fragment of a receipt. John Gibbson to Jacob Ellegood. 1792.
- F1-8 Receipt. Gordons and Stanley [London] to James Parker. 16 August 1792, received 18 August 1792. On reverse: [Lane] Blades. 18 August 1792. Paid.
- F1-9 Statement of account from 4 October 1790-23 January 1793. Peter Elmsly, London, to Jacob Ellegood, Fredericton, NB. 25 January 1793. Elmsly was Ellegood's London agent and his brother-in-law. The document lists many payees of Ellegood's orders on Elmsly. Other names: Taylor, Parker, Saunders, Thompson, Lambert, Reid, Jarvis, Stewart, Whitlock, Wilson, and others.
- F1-10 Statement of account. [S.] Hutchison to [Jacob] Ellegood. 10 June 1793. Payment received in full 23 August 1793.

- F1-11 Receipt. Isaac Hedden to James Taylor acknowledging payment of Taylor's fine of two pounds refusing to serve as a constable. 15 February 1794.
- F1-12 Letter from Peter Elmsly, Sloan Street, London, to Lieut.Col. Jacob Ellegood, Frederick Town, New Brunswick, North America. 7 December 1796. Elmsly reports that "the Exchequer Cow is now dry" i.e. that the last of Ellegood's Loyalist compensation has been paid. Received 11 April 1797.
- F1-13 Letter from Jacob Ellegood, at The Manor, to Jacob Ellegood Jr., [Fredericton]. Concerns errands and trespassers on his property: 21 December 1796. Other names: Wilkins, Capt. Stewart, Capt. Davidson.
- F1-14 Receipt. E Morton to Master Samuel Ellegood. 14 February 1797.
- F1-15 Receipt. Jasper Ruckel to Connel Alegood [Jacob Ellegood]. 29 January 1798.
- F1-16 Bill of Lading. Concerns goods shipped by William & Thomas Pagan & Co, [Saint John] to Jacob Ellegood. Signed by James Segee. 10 May 1798.
- F1-17 Letter from John S. Ellegood, St. John, to his brother Jacob Ellegood Jr., Fredericton. 23 May [1798]. Includes shipping news, militia activities, and comments on dancing master. Other names: McLeod, Fraser, Leonard, Sproule, Lovitt. a
- F1-18 Letter from John Ellegood [St. John] to his brother Jacob Ellegood Jr., Fredericton. 20 September 1798. Includes shipping news, family affairs, and the mention of fires raging in New York, Boston and Philadelphia. Other names: Black, Bell, Lee, Pagan, Lane, Thomson, Disbrow, Samuel Ellegood.
- F1-19 Letter from John Ellegood, St. John, NB, to his brother Jacob Ellegood Jr., Fredericton. 8 October 1798. Other names: Alexander Black, Disbrow, Segee, Pagan, [Thomas] Millidge.

- F2-1 Letter from A. [Allan/Allaire] Presque'Isle [Garrison] to Jacob Ellegood. The Manor: 25 October 1800. Concerns letting Nyles clear and use the writer's land to grow crops. Other names: Mary [wife], Sam [Ellegood], Miss Saunders, Jacob Ellegood Sr., E. Tompkins.
- F2-2 Letter from John S. Ellegood, Saint John, to his brother Jacob Ellegood Jr., Prince William. 19 February 1801. Concerns their father's projected trip to Virginia "in August next", news of two forthcoming marriages, and other social news ". [We] have been very gay here this winter with Plays, Assemblies, Gregories & Private Balls... The Plays in General have been much admired and

seem to get on well” Other names: Bell, Robert Hazen, Mary Jarvis, Miss Saunders, Capt. McKay, Miss Sands, [Mary] Odell.

- F2-3 Letter [incomplete] from John S. Ellegood, St. John, to [Jacob Ellegood Jr.]. 14 March 1801. Political, social, and business news. Other names: Miss Rogers, Miss Cooks, Mr. Black, Sproule, Rogers Bell & Co, Smith & Miller, Thomas Millidge, William Pagan, Robert Hazen, Mary Jarvis, Munson Jarvis, Edward Winslow, Thomas Carleton, Thompson & Reid.
- F2-4 Letter from John S. Ellegood, St. John, to Jacob Ellegood Jr., Prince William. 26 May 1801. Military affairs, Saint John Volunteers, shipping news. Other names: Eccles, John Black, James Campbell, Capt. David Mowat, G. Handford, Davidson, Samuel Ellegood, Aunt McKay, Richard Armstrong, Capt. Pine.
- F2-5 Statement of account. William & Thomas Pagan Co., [Saint John], to John S. Ellegood, St. John. 23 June 1803. Apparently covering goods for establishing a store. Other names: Segee.
- F2-6 Receipts. Garrett Clopper, [Fredericton], to John Saunders Ellegood. 24 October 1802 and 2 July 1803. Concerns registrar’s fees and a tavern licence.
- F2-7 Receipt. Thomas Peters to John S. Alligood [Ellegood]. 26 July 1803.
- F2-8 Letter [part missing]. Thomas Millidge, [Saint John], to John S. Ellegood, Fredericton. 3 September 1803. Other names: Segee.
- F2-9 Letter from Thomas Millidge Jr., St. John, to John S. Ellegood, Fredericton. 3 October 1803, received 5 October 1803. Concerns the death of Stephen Millidge, Westmorland. Other names: Segee.
- F2-10 Letter from Thomas Mathews, Norfolk, Virginia, to Jacob Ellegood. 27 October 1803. Family news. Other names: Samuel [no surname given].
- F2-11 Statement of account. John Payne to John S. Ellegood. 24 December 1803, received 26 January 1804.
- F2-12 Letter from Thomas Millidge Jr., St. John, to John S. Ellegood. 23 January 1804, received 26 January 1804. Business news. Other names: James, Morris Robinson, Pagan, Ritchie, Wilmot.

Precept issued for failure to perform highway labour. 25 January 1808. Other names: Jonah Allan, Constable of Prince William.

- F2-19 Fragment of a legal document issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace. October 1808.
- F2-20 Note of hand. Ezekiel Sloat in favour of Thomas [Firto]. 7 October 1808.
- F2-21 Statement of account from 12 [January] 1808 - 20 March 1808 to Jacob Ellegood, Esq. 24 December 1808.

Other names: Jacob Ellegood, Thomas Saunders, Hamilton Davidson, Mrs. Atchison, Mrs. Atherton, James Taylor, Dr. Emerson, George Sproule, Brigadier-General Smyth, Commander- in- Chief of the Province of New Brunswick.
- F3-2 Statement of account. John S. Ellegood to Rev. George Pidgeon. 26 March 1814. Other names: Judge [Edward] Winslow.
- F3-3 Subpoena issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace for York County, “to any of the Constables of the Parish of Queensbury” to summon John Daton, John Parent, William Harris, James Ferman, to give evidence in the suit of Anthony Manuel vs. Solomon Parent. 6 March 1815.
- F3-4 Execution. Daniel Morehouse, JP [Queensbury], orders goods of Joseph Drake sold to satisfy a judgement in favour of Daniel Perley. 57 Geo 111 (c.1817). Document damage.

- F3-5 Statement of account. [Unnamed blacksmith] to Jacob Ellegood. 28 January 1818.
- F3-6 Letter (incomplete) from a sister or sister-in-law. [Donation, Virginia], to Jacob Ellegood. 22 August 1818. Concerns the death of her husband and the deaths of several other family members. Family hardships. Other names: Peggy Ellegood, Uncle Saunders, Grandfather Saunders, John Thorowgood, William, Rebecca, Claudia, James Thorowgood, Mary, Molly, Robert Dixon, Blacks, and Rose Hall, Virginia.
- F3-7 Summons. Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace for York County, orders the Constable for the Parish of Prince William to summon a jury to try the suit of John Hoyt vs. Benjamin Owen. 28 June 1819. Other names: Moses Hoyt, Thomas Jones, William Joslin, William Davidson. Settled by arbitration.
- F3-8 Summons issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace, for the arrest of Joseph Drake, John Dunlap Jr., Alexander Bate Jr., William Tompkins, Isaac Miller, and Oliver Miller, [all of Northhampton], for failure to perform highway labour. 16 December 1819. Other names: Lockwood, D. Fox.

File 4: Documents Dated 1820 -1918

- F4-1 Complaint sworn before Jacob Ellegood by Moses Hoyt of the Parish of Prince William, York County, that his house was robbed by John Coughgen. 27 February 1820. Other names: Newcomb, Mr. Kitchen, Mrs. Burgoyne. On the reverse of the document is the draft of James Tweedie's memorial for land in the rear of The Barony owned by Hon. Judge Saunders. 28 June 1821.
- F4-2 Warrant issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace for York County, to one of the Constables of the Parish of Queensbury, for the arrest of Joseph Hart, Queensbury, for threatening harm to James Flint of the Parish of Queensbury. 11 August 1820.
- F4-3 Summons issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace, to Daniel Perley, Parish of Queensbury, to answer the suit of the subscribers of the Upper Queensbury school for one year's subscription. 4 October 1820. Summons served, 16 October 1820. Other names: Abraham Lint. On the reverse of the document is the memorandum of Perley's settlement.
- F4-4 Warrant issued by Jacob Ellegood, Justice of the Peace, to one to the Constable of the Parish of Queensbury for the seizure of property of Jacob McKeen to satisfy a judgement recovered by George Wheeler. 9 June 1821.
- F4-5 Summons issued by Jacob Ellegood, JP, to James Tilley, Prince William, in answer to

the suit of Isaac Fletcher for debt. 17 September 1821.

- F4-6 Jury summons issued by Jacob Ellegood, JP, to one of the Constables of Queensbury to try the cause of John [Park] Sr. against Andrew Carney. 24 September 1821. Other names: Thomas Parent, James Parent, Isaiah Parent.
- F4-7 Fragment of a bill to Jacob Ellegood. 5 June 1822.
- F4-8 Fragment of a copy book of Rebecca Ellegood, Prince William, including sections of two poems. 1829.
- F4-9 Document stating the age and family size of Thomas Dalling and William Elliott, Richmond Settlement. [c.1820's]. Other names: Robert Casement.
- F4-10 Fragment of a poem signed "Bob". 15 April 1908. Other names: Jones, Byron, William Lawrence, Raymond E. Holyoke, M. Sprague, Nevers.

File 5: Jacob S. Ellegood's Journal, 1 May 1800 - 25 March 1801.

- F5-1 Jacob S. Ellegood's journal is a daily record for a period of approximately ten months. It contains one hundred and thirty six pages of hand written notes that are remarkably readable, considering the age and condition of the manuscript. Included is a daily record of weather conditions and wind directions; information on vessels entering and clearing the port of Saint John with the names of their captains, the ports from which they sailed, their destinations, and frequently the names of arriving passengers; details of vessels arriving from the St. John River and those leaving to sail up the River. Mention is made of social events, especially plays, distinguished visitors to the City, and other personal and social activities. At the end of the Journal there is a tabulated page entitled "List of Vessels arrived at Saint John" May 2 - June 5 [1800], and a similar page entitled "List of Vessels sailed from Saint John" May 4 - June 5 [1800]. Each list gives the date of arrival or sailing, the rig, the name of the vessel and the master's name, "where from or where to" and the passage time for a few of the arrivals. There is a gap in the Journal from 25 June 1800 to 5 July 1800. It appears that pages have been removed.
