ANTIGUA

It comprises (i) a sealed envelope described on the outside as fragments; (ii) a note in an apparently 18th-century hand describing the extent of the pilot and defining limits of the charter of the South Sea Company. As the pilot and defining the limits of the charter of the South Sea Company. As the company flourished between 1711 and 1720 the note may have been written at that time; (iii) a note on a flyleaf, 'Monies lent by Charles Swann', above the names of Will. Smith, Capt. Harris, Mr. Masters, Thomas Emit, Mr. Mathues and Capt. Teal, with the amounts lent; (iv) another flyleaf, partly torn away, on which an account, perhaps of an interrogation in which the ship 'Signit' is named, is written, signed 'Charls Swan Capn'; (v) the pilot of 95 folios numbered 4-43 and 46-100. The hand in the pilot is the same as that on the flyleaves. There is no certainty from swan's signature, that the hand is his; but the book may be his work, or the work of one of his crew, or it may have come into his possession with some other source. After folio 15 two folios, never numbered in the P.R.O., are missing. Eight more are missing after the last numbered folio. The numbers of folios missing can be ascertained by an examination of fragments remaining in the binding. It could be implied from the missing eight that the pilot extended south of Valdivia; and from (ii) above, where its extents is given as from Acapulo to Valdivia, that the missing folios were torn out before 1711, if in fact the pilot did extend south of Valdivia.

Charles Swan would appear to be the man who, having in earlier times served with Morgan, in 1684 set out in the ship Cygnet, armed and manned as a privateer, to trade on the West Coast of South America. Swan, in Brig. -Gen. E. A. Cruikshank's The Life of Sir Henry Morgan (Toronto, 1935) is described as 'a master mariner [with] knowledge of the Spanish language and acquaintance with the country...' One of his supercargoes was William Dampier, some reference to Swan's piratical activities on his voyage can be found in his letter to Capt of Richard Arnold, taken on or about 4 August 1686 in Jamaica (C.O. 1/58 no. 20 I). Both appear in the Calendar of State Papers Colonial, America and West Indies. The examination refers to Capt. Peter Harris (? The Capt. Harris on the flyleaf at (iii) above) and tells of Swan's intention to return to England via the Philippines. Cruikshank states (p. 397) that Swan was killed by accident, or in a brawl, at Mindinao. Dampier sailed the ship as far as Madagascar, where she was scuttled. Swans voyage in 1684/5 on the South American Coast went from south to north. The pilot is drawn in reverse direction. It is possible that it was compiled on another voyage, either by Swan himself, or by someone from whom he obtained it.

Two folios, numbered 44 and 45, are not part of the book but an insertion, dated Jan. 1777, containing an account of plant and animal life of an area said to be inhabited by kangaroos.
