

## PROPER NOUNS IN THE DIARY OF THOMAS O. MILES

The following list is of the earliest occurrence of those proper nouns that appear at least once in the diary, and includes all personal names, all vessels, lesser- and little-known landmarks, and domestic animals. Common place-names, as Maugerville, St. John, etc. are omitted. Among those identified by family-name only, there doubtlessly are a number of duplications. The notations appearing after most dates are not quotations. Dates are given yr./mo./day. The Diary is not paginated; and the names are left in chronological order that chronology may be used as a finding-aid.

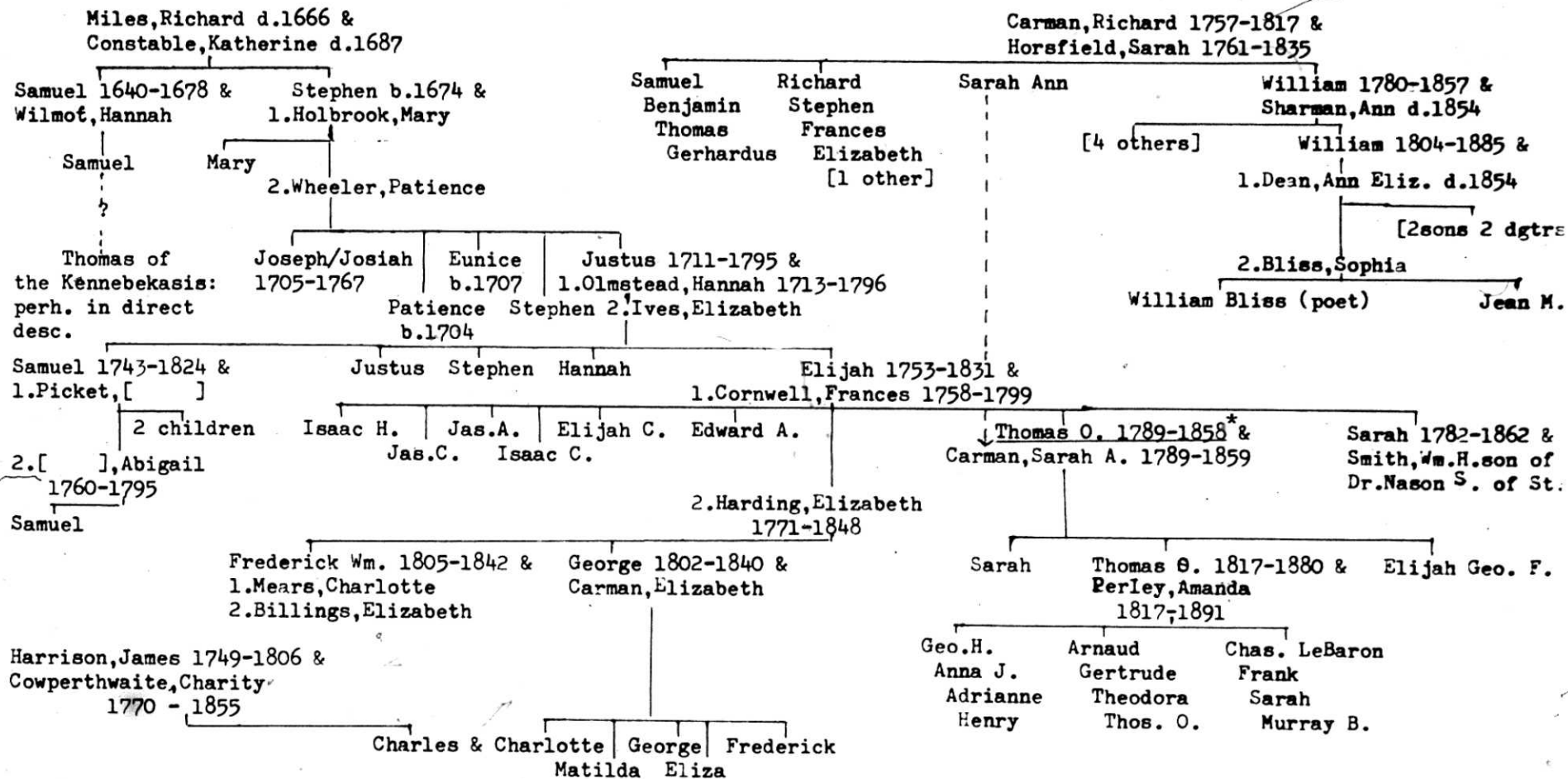

Notes:

Thos. O. Miles 1789-1853 and George Miles 1802-1840 are half brothers and their respective wives, Sarah Ann and Elizabeth (Carman) are sisters.

Elijah Miles has two sons Isaac and two James: common in the period when one child has died very young.

The name Cornwell is uncertain: sources vary.

Elijah Miles and Richard Carman are Loyalist coevals and near neighbors.
